with their building fund. Chris also indicated that since the

recent ballot measure failed the state will try to withhold property

taxes paid to the city. It was also reported the Jiffy Lube on the

corner of RB and Pomerado Rd is up to code and the owners are

being pro-active in trying to find another business for that area. Chris

also confirmed that Carl DeMaio will be our July speaker.

Supervisor Pam Slater Price's Representative Erica Holloway Report.

Erica reported on the recent election. She said there was a 40% turnout

with 50% of those who voted were by mail. Budget hearings are coming

up Tuesday June 8 and 9. The county has had two rounds of layoffs, but

maintaining essential services to the public is the top priority for the

county. Erica also stated that two hearing for a new

sheriff are to be held
